HIGHER EDUCATION EMERGENCY RELIEF FUNDS HEERF II

Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act 2021 (CRRSAA)

College of Hair Design Careers has applied and was approved for the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act 2021 (CRRSAA) Emergency Financial Aid Grants for Students. We have signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement, given the College of Hair Design Careers will use the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA 314(a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

College of Hair Design Careers CRRSAA allocation for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students was \$80,485.00. The college drew down \$ 64,392.00 for (24) students who qualified with a zero EFC and met all the requirements for the grant. The college then drew down \$16,093.00 for (7) student who qualified with an EFC greater than zero and also met all the requirements for the grant. The grant money was drawn down 02/02/2022 and disbursed to the qualifying student 02/04/2022 to total \$80,485.00

College of Hair Design Careers method to determine which students would receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants, including how much they would receive under CRRSAA 314(a)(4) of the CARES Act is to determine how many eligible students are PELL eligible with a zero EFC. After the college determined the number of students that meet the criteria; the college then divide the designated CRRSAA funds allowed to be drawn down from the grant management system by the number of eligible students. If there are not enough students that meet our initial criteria; the criteria will change to PELL eligible students in the next category. The college then issued and distributed each eligible student in the cohort the same amount of grant funds in the form of a check.

College of Hair Design Careers instructions to students regarding this grant were to inform them of the federal requirement that the grant funds are for students to use for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to the coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or childcare. Students were asked to return a signature form for their file that acknowledges when they receive the grant funds for tracking purposes and reporting requirements.

College of Hair Design Careers has tracked the checks and as of the date of this report all the checks were cashed by the recipients and the account has been completely disbursed to the qualifying students.
